Located in Virginia Beach right in the downtown area on 1956 Laskin Road. Now with five other beach locations, this one has become a must in Virginia Beach for all seafood buffet lovers.

This wooden-style beachnik property houses two of the largest stained glass ceiling artworks, which are both 34 feet in diameter and weight 5 tons. Both hang overhead in two of the dining halls as onlookers gaze into the nautical scene of fish and mermaids. Both were purchased in 1984 for \$125,000 each.

Upon parking your car you begin to unwind from your daily grind. Even though this is a buffet style restaurant, it isn't the usual rushed assembly-line style most customers are used to. The buffet stations are adequately broken down into smaller stations.

Once inside you will sit at a vinyl booth or one of the finished oak tables and chairs with each room decorated in a different nautical theme. Don't forget to order one of many fine Virginia wines with your meal. Unlimited quantities of soda, coffee, and tea are also available.

Relax and let the feast begin! Whether you start your meal with a trip to the salad bar to start with homemade crab salad and crackers or with homemade New England Clam Chowder, the wait staff will keep your beverages flowing and your condiments filled. Fresh salad vegetables are also available, so make your own salad.
